REGULATIONS FOR CONDUCTING BUSINESS AT PORT AUTHORITY FACILITIES

Charter Boats

A CHARTER BOAT IS ANY BOAT THAT CHARGES A FEE TO CUSTOMERS FOR FISHING, SAILING, SIGHTSEEING OR DIVING.

Anyone conducting a charter business from their boat within any Port Authority marina, or utilizing Port Authority docking, must register with the Port Authority and provide a "Certificate of Liability Insurance", including without limitation, charter boat coverage. All charter boaters will be charged an additional fee for operating a charter boat business in the marina to be determined each season.

Commercial Businesses

Anyone conducting charter or commercial business from their boat within any Port Authority facility must register with the Port Authority on forms provided at the marina office.

A private owner wishing to sell his boat does not constitute conducting business from his boat.
